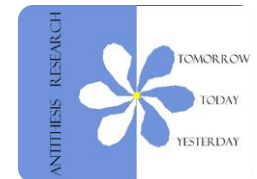

The Sustainable Community Project is a collaborative effort between the Spokane Tribe of Indians and Antithesis Research, a Native American Non-Profit Organization.

The project's philosophy is Seven Generation Planning - "Meeting the needs of the present generation without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs" (Dan Glickman, Secretary of Agriculture, 1997).

Antithesis Research Associates are dedicated to creating livable communities while improving quality of life through energy efficient housing, public transportation, preserving natural environments, and by supporting sustainable economic development.

STOI Mission:

To achieve true sovereignty by attaining self-sufficiency. The tribe seeks to preserve and enhance its traditional values by living and teaching the inherent principles of respect, honor, and integrity, as embodied in tribal language and life-ways.

Mission:

"Promote the six livability principles, while consolidating tribal resources and building relationships with the surrounding region to ensure a sustainable future for the Spokane Tribe of Indians."

Six Livability Principles:

- Provide More Transportation Choices
- Promote Equitable, Affordable Housing
- Enhance Economic Competitiveness
- Support Existing Communities
- Coordinate Policies and Leverage Investments
- Value Communities and Neighborhoods

Sustainable Community Project:

The Spokane Tribe of Indians was awarded a HUD "community challenge" planning grant, which has funded the Sustainable Community Project. The goal of the project is to bring the community, government, and business together to create a living document that will guide the tribe for the next seven generations. The sustainable community project elements, goals, objectives, and policies will be primarily dictated by community participation, but will also reflect collaboration between Tribal program directors, managers, and Tribal Business Council. Antithesis Research Associates' role is to facilitate the process and provide technical knowledge as requested.
