

SPOKANE TRIBE OF INDIANS 2015-2016 GRAY WOLF HUNTING SEASONS AND REGULATIONS

Spokane Tribal Resolution 2015-2016

Hunting and fishing within the boundaries of the Spokane Indian Reservation is open only to enrolled members of the Spokane Tribe. Violations will be subject to confiscation of materials used in an unlawful act and will be prosecuted in Tribal court as a civil or criminal offense. GRAY WOLF

Eligibility: Open to enrolled Spokane Tribal Members only

Season: **Open year around**

Quota: The 2015-2016 gray wolf hunting season will close once **six** individuals are harvested.

Regulations:

1. No more than one gray wolf per Tribal Member **per calendar year.**
2. No more than one gray wolf per household **per calendar year.**
3. Trapping and/or snaring will be allowed by special permit only.
4. Tracking dogs will **not** be allowed.
5. Individuals outfitted with radio-collars are **not** to be harvested.
6. Radio-telemetry may **not** be used to assist in gray wolf harvest
7. All gray wolf kills are to be reported within 24 hours to either the Department of Natural Resources (Wellpinit) or the Public Safety Building (Wellpinit). Failure to do so will result in a \$2500.00 fine.
8. Hunters are not required to save the meat from harvested gray wolves.
9. Unintentional takes must be turned into the Spokane Tribe of Indians Department of Natural Resources immediately.

The above seasons and regulations are subject to change at the discretion of the Spokane Tribal Business Council.
