Covid-19 Protocols For Fully Vaccinated Individuals.

After receiving a lot of great questions regarding Covid-19 protocols for vaccinated individuals, I wanted to share some knowledge from the CDC.

FULLY VACCINATED PEOPLE WITH NO COVID-LIKE SYMPTOMS FOLLOWING AN EXPOSURE TO SOMEONE WITH SUSPECTED OR CONFIRMED COVID-19

Fully vaccinated people should be tested 3-5 days following a known exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 and wear a mask in public indoor settings for 14 days or until they receive a negative test result. They should isolate if they test positive. Fully vaccinated people who live in a household with someone who is immunosuppressed at increased risk of severe disease, or unvaccinated (including children <12 years of age) could also consider masking at home for 14 days following a known exposure or until they receive a negative test result. Most fully vaccinated people with no COVID-like symptoms do not need to quarantine or be restricted from work following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, if they follow the testing and masking recommendation above. Fully vaccinated people should monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days following an exposure.

FULLY VACCINATED PEOPLE WITH NO COVID-19-LIKE SYMPTOMS AND NO KNOWN EXPOSURE TO SOMEONE WITH SUSPECTED OR CONFIRMED COVID-19

It is recommended that fully vaccinated people with no COVID-19-like symptoms and no known exposure should be exempted from routine screening testing programs, if feasible.

Although masks are currently **NOT REQUIRED** for **VACCINATED INDIVIDUALS**. We may reconsider the requirement and **MANDATE** masks for **ALL INDIVIDUALS**. The OED will have an update on this topic on August 3rd.
